Meet Tim and Karen Mindling

Tim and Karen Mindling serve through SEND International and are former missionaries to Afghanistan. They have 3 grown children and 2 granddaughters. First Parish has supported the Mindlings for many years and they have visited our church several times. They are very good at sending quarterly letters and updates including prayer requests.

They presently live in Michigan and are working with long term and newly arrived Afghan refugees who are being settled in the Detroit area. They help families get settled in apartments, get kids in school, find health care, and navigate the financial system. They have become friends, even surrogate grandparents, when they visit and pray with old and new families.

The Mindlings also try to be a resource to many churches that want to find a way to be involved in this opportunity to be the hands and feet of Christ to the world that has come to our doorstep.

In the past 8-10 years Tom has had serious health problems including multiple back surgeries. He is presently having treatment for an irregular heartbeat.

They ask us to pray for Tim's health and their work sharing the message of Hope and the Light of Christ to the Afghan families.

They are wholeheartedly involved in this mission and their faith has never faulted.

Again this year, First Parish will be partnering with First Baptist in preparing for Operation Christmas Child. Last year our church families filled 117 boxes with toys and school supplies for children ages 2-14.

The collection will start on Sunday, October 30th when folded boxes (or flat if you prefer) will be available. **The last day to return the filled box will be three weeks later, November 20th.**
