Preparing for Stewardship Month

Looking out my window this morning and one of the maple trees is clearly telling me that fall is here; summer is past, Labor Day is over, and we just celebrated National Back to Church Sunday. In the normal church calendar, the next event is

our Stewardship Month.

Several years ago, Pastor Rich would remind the church family that the new year was coming and pledging how much we might contribute to the next year's budget so the church leadership could prepare the budget for the January Annual Meeting.

On September 11th, the church met for a financial update. I received a few calls and emails due to some confusion after that meeting. The report noted that church was running behind and that we should all be encouraged to see if we can dig a little deeper for 2023. Especially if we fulfill the desire of the Christian Education Ministry, Search Committee, Diaconate, Vision Team along with our other committees by hiring a full-time associate pastor to work with our younger children and families building growth for the future.

Some projections were less positive than others, but just to clarify, the church generally ends each year a little behind. This is because we passed a deficit budget. Thankfully the interest we receive from trust funds and other investments usually helps to balance things out. It is obvious, if we hire an associate pastor, it will take more creative thinking.

According to the church treasurer, Brian Roden, our current deficit is around \$11,000 from our budget of \$521,000; and we have both restricted and unrestricted trust funds of around 2.4 million. The portion of those funds that are unrestricted comes to a little over \$400,000 and with two recent bequests, we have an additional \$163,000.

I share this information, so you have a little more understanding. As I noted at the special meeting, it would be a good thing to consider starting a building fund, so we don't have to keep chipping away at the trust fund money. Those balances help provide interest to aid us in catching up at the end of the year. The best news of all we heard on Sept.11th, is that we have the two bequests of \$163,000 and that would be a great help if we go forward with hiring an associate.

If you have further questions, I'm sure the church treasurer would be glad to confirm the unrestricted fund monies and the recent bequest information. Ultimately, this is an exciting time for First Parish as this fall, we will decide the future direction of our congregation. On October 1, at 10:00 a.m., we will gather to share our vision and dreams for First Parish's future. I hope many of you will attend this meeting so you can participate.

Samaritan's Purse suggests a "WOW" gift such as a stuffed animal, a doll or a soccer ball with pump.


Smaller items might include a jump rope, toy cars, a toothbrush, a solar calculator, and pens and pencils.
