We do not know what the future holds, but we know Who holds the future.

Dear First Parish Family and Friends,

It is a great privilege to connect with you about the life of First Parish as we reflect on our blessings and works of the church in 2022. We have kept our focus always on the Lord working through various hardships but remaining strong in the spiritual welfare of our membership and in the community. First Parish expresses gratitude as we are blessed by the support and contributions from all of you. There are many parts of the Church and it takes each one of us to provide our spiritual and financial gifts to keep us going. God has put you here at this time and for His purpose. Our hope is you know Him personally.

As we move into 2023, we are seeking God to guide us into the future bringing growth through new members and increasing staff to support young families and children. We are encouraged by the participation of First Parish family and friends during the ongoing Vision meetings and hope that our prayers for the future will be answered. Growth is coming in our church both in the building and in our hearts. Sharing the gospel, heat, and light, caring for and maintaining what God has given to us as we ask Him for what we need. May we be good stewards of His gifts as we seek to do His will. Considering anticipated expenses and asking for enough to plan for the future creates a target of \$600,000 as our goal. This may seem out of reach for some, but it is not. When you allow God to work in and through you and you seek Him in all things, ALL things become possible with God.

This year reminds us that financial support, in the form of a pledge to the Operating Budget of First Parish, is vital to carry out the church's work. As we gather for worship inside our building, we continue to be the body of Christ through our ministries, our witness, and our care for one another. We cannot know what lies ahead of us, but we remain confident in the assurance of God's abiding and steadfast love. Because of your generous and faithful gifts, our church can keep doing what love requires of us by nurturing life-giving, joyful ministries both inside our church walls along with our community and beyond.

Our hope is that we become a tithing church and continue to move in this direction. Tithing is a biblical principle that means giving one tenth of what the Lord has given to us. The process is to give it first, off the top, and then live off the nine tenths left. A practice of tithing teaches you how you can depend on the Lord and in return you will receive blessings from trusting in the Lord. Some members tithe, committing ten percent of their income to the work and missions of our church. Others give proportionally by committing a certain percentage. Still, others give as they are able. As you consider your support in the form of a financial pledge and/or working towards tithing, consider increasing your weekly offering by \$5, tithe on each Communion Sunday or raise your annual giving by 1%. He blesses you as you see His hand moving in your finances. Your trust in Him increases. Turn your attention to the Giver of all good things, and rest in the knowledge that you are complete in Him. The one thing you absolutely need is the one thing you can never lose: Jesus' presence with you.

A MISSION MOMENT from Outreach

Meet Craig and Layni Soderberg

Craig and Layni Soderberg are Bible translators who have been working in a predominately Muslim nation in Southeast Asia for many years. They are missionaries with Pioneer Bible Translators. They have translated Bible stories into the IBWE language and trained their colleagues to use these stories to establish fellowships of believers among the people.

They are now part of a team translating the Bible, one book at a time, into the IBWE language. This takes an amazing effort using native translators, doing multiple drafts, and having every book checked by a certified Bible translation consultant along the way. They are very grateful for their native speakers.

Recently they partnered with another mission agency to sponsor a training seminar for about 60 local people. The training was in evangelism, discipleship, and church planting. Their goal is to find two local families that they can bring onto their team to work with them using the IBWE scriptures.

They ask for prayer for wisdom as they test the book of Mark and the draft of Esther. In 2021 they created a Daily Prayer Partners program with the goal of having 1000 partners. Each day the partners receive a prayer request for the missionaries and for the people to come to know

the Lord through their efforts. There are presently 350 partners. (Pray4TheBanjar.com)

Craig grew up in Lynnfield and Layni is from Malaysia They have two sons, Josiah, born in 2013 and Samuel born on December 31, 2019. Update: Craig and Layni and the boys are presently in Idaho where they will reside until they receive US Citizenship for Samuel. They did this to get the citizenship for Josiah a few years ago. Apparently, Idaho has the shortest wait time to get a citizenship. While there they are working remotely with the blessings of their supervisors. We look forward to seeing them next spring before they return to Indonesia.
